

# JUNIOR BEEF CATTLE – DEPARTMENT N

1. Beef cattle will check-in beginning at 10am Tuesday, September 19, 2023.
2. All Beef cattle must be in place by Tuesday, September 19, 2023 by 12 pm.
3. Weigh – In begins Tuesday, September 19, 2023 at 2 pm.
4. Mandatory exhibitors meeting Thursday, September 21, 2023 at 8:30 am.
5. Show will begin at 9am. Thursday, September 21st.
6. Blocking/grooming chutes will not be allowed in the aisles or on the asphalt inside of the barn. An area will be provided for chutes. **ALL AISLES MUST REMAIN CLEAR!**

## Breeding Beef – Division 1

### Purebred and Composite

1. Breeds : Angus, Braunveh, Mini Hereford, Simmental, Red Angus Hereford, Charolais, Shorthorn, Maintainer, AOB, Santa Gertrudis
2. Junior entries cannot compete in the Open Division with the exception that Junior Grand Champion male and female from each breed may cross over into Open classes.
3. Exhibitors are limited to 2 animals per class with a limit of 2 market steers.
4. All senior bulls, one year or older, must be shown with nose ring or nose clip with lead.
5. Faulkner County pure bred heifers and composite bred heifers will compete for an overall Faulkner County special award. Heifers must be born and bred in Faulkner County to be eligible. There will be no reserve for the special award.

1. Junior heifer calves, calved between Jan. 1 & April 30, 2023

4. Junior yearling heifers, calved between Jan. 1 & April 30, 2022
5. Senior yearling heifers, calved between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31, 2021
6. Two year old heifers, calved between May 1 & Aug. 31, 2021
7. Cow/calf pair, any age calf must be sucking
8. Grand Champion Female

- 9. Reserve Champion Female SPECIAL AWARD
- 10. Junior bull calves, calved between Jan. 1 & April 30, 2023
- 11. Senior bull calves, calved between Sept. 1 & Dec. 31, 2022
- 12. Summer yearling bulls, calved between May 1 & Aug. 31, 2021
- 13. Junior yearling bulls, calved between Jan. 1 & April 30, 2022
- 14. Senior yearling bulls, calved between Sept. 1 & Dec. 31, 2021
- 15. Aged bulls, before Sept. 1, 2022
- 16. Grand Champion Bull SPECIAL AWARD
- 17. Reserve Champion Bull SPECIAL AWARD
- 18. Pair of Females, owned and bred by exhibitor

**CLASS**

- 19. Pair of animals, one bull and one female
- 20. Get of Sire, 4 animals, both sexes by same sire **All Grand**

**Champion Females will return for Supreme Champion Female**

**All Grand Champion Bulls will return for Supreme Champion Bulls**

**Supreme Female and Supreme Bull will compete for Supreme Animal of Show**

**\*ONLY JUNIOR EXHIBITORS RECEIVE AWARDS**

**Faulkner County Bred Replacement Females – Division 2**

- 1. Heifers must be born and bred in Faulkner County to be eligible for this class.
- 2. Animals must be nominated for the fair by August 31, 2023, with the Faulkner County Extension Office.
- 3. Animals born between January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 and April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023 are eligible.
- 4. The breeder of the heifer must sign the nomination form certifying that the animal was born & bred in Faulkner County. They must also certify that the heifer is not greater than 75% of any given breed.
- 5. Heifers shown in the Faulkner County Bred Class are not eligible to show in the regular Commercial Heifer Class. Likewise, Crossbred Heifers will not be eligible to show in the Faulkner County Bred Class.
- 6. Heifer classes will be broken into the following groups: American, English, and Exotic. Individual classes will be divided by weight.
- 7. Exhibitors must have ownership of the animals by July 1st, 2023 to be eligible to show in this class.
- 8. All County Bred Heifers must be classified prior to August 31, 2023.

9. Faulkner County Heifers will compete for an overall Faulkner County Special Award. Heifers must be born and bred in Faulkner County to be eligible. There will be no reserve for the special award.

**Crossbred Heifers – Division 3**

Crossbred heifers may be divided into 3 classes based on age and breed (American, English, and Exotic) at the discretion of show committee. NOTE: A heifer shown in this class **cannot** be considered for Faulkner County Bred.

**Crossbred Cows – Division 4**

- 1. Crossbred cows must be 2 – 3 years old and first year to calve.
- 2. Crossbred cows may be divided into 3 classes based on breed (American, English & Exotic) at the discretion of show committee.

PLACING:    1ST 2ND 3RD 4TH 5TH 6TH 7TH  
POINTS:        10  8    6    4    3    2    1

Divided by Age

- 1. Grand Champion Crossbred Cow SPECIAL AWARD

2. Reserve Champion Crossbred Cow

**Crossbred Cow/Calf Pair – Division 5**

- 1. The Crossbred Cow/Calf Pair Class will be divided the same as the Crossbred Cow and Heifer classes.
- 2. Cows may be any age
- 3. Calf must be sucking at the time of show.

**Junior Market Steers – Division 6**

- 1. All steers must be weighed by the Show Officials to be eligible for the gain ability awards.
- 2. The minimum weight of animals entered is 850 pounds. Lighter animals will not be accepted.
- 3. Weights at weigh-in will be used to determine show classification.
- 4. Steers may be divided into 3 classes based on weight.
- 5. Each exhibitor will be limited to two entries.
- 6. All animals must be clipped, groomed, and broke to show. Each steer must be dehorned and properly castrated.

- 1. Divided by Weight
- 2. Grand Champion Market Steer SPECIAL AWARD
- 3. Reserve Champion Market Steer SPECIAL AWARD

Note: No Crossbred Animals will cross over.

**Arkansas Feeder Steer – Division 7**

- 1. All feeder steers must weigh a maximum of 849 pounds at weigh-in at the County Fair.
- 2. The steers must be shown by a currently enrolled 4-H, FFA, or FCCLA member.
- 3. Each exhibitor is limited to two (2) entries in this show.
- 4. The steer must have been born and raised in Arkansas and certified by a County Extension Agent or Vo-Ag teacher.
- 5. All breeds will be shown together, and classes will be divided by weights recorded at weigh-in time at the County Fair. Placing of classes will be 100% show ring placing by the judge. None of the animals will be eligible for the Faulkner County Junior Livestock Auction in 2023.
